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<u>Money – Page 2</u>

Americans spend more than 30 percent of their income on luxury items, compared to less than 10 percent just forty years ago. Statistics on personal consumption published by the *U.S. Bureau of Economic Analysis* reveal that American's spending on recreation rose from 42.7 billion in 1970 to 246.8 billion in 1988 – a 477 percent increase!

Some people say, "I'm always short on money." What do you think are some reasons they *feel* this way or *really are* this way? Why don't some people have enough money? Possible answers include: 1) They do; they just think they don't. 2) God is testing their faith. 3) They have misused what God has given them. Here is the good news – God is not silent on the subject of money! In fact, you may be surprised to learn that:

- 16 out of 38 parables taught by the Lord Jesus were on the subject of money and possessions.
- Christ said more about money and possessions than He did about the subjects of heaven and hell *combined*!
- In the Gospels, one out of ten verses deals with money and possessions.
- In the Bible there are over 500 references to prayer, and less than 500 references to faith, but there are over 2,000 references to money and possessions!

The Protestant work ethic has brought the so-called "good life" to American Christians as they experience unprecedented prosperity. But with prosperity have come materialism, self-indulgence, and ease. Well-intentioned Christians often desire to obey Scripture when it comes to handling their finances, but many have succumbed to the call of a materialistic lifestyle.

This lesson goes right to the heart of a Christian's relationship with God. The use of money reveals whether one is motivated by the Spirit of God or by self.

Comment:

Preaching on finances is important, and necessary. Jesus preached about money. Pastor mentions this subject an appropriate amount of time – enough but not too much.

III. STEWARDSHIP OF OUR TIME

A. A Biblical Perspective of Time

God instructs us how to use our time. Great men




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and women of God have served God with a sense of urgency. Time management is really selfmanagement, and for Christians this means Spiritmanagement (being controlled by the Spirit of God).

Forge, Pennsylvania. He was a pioneer in the mass marketing of life and health insurance, and he became a wealthy businessman. He was also a committed Christian layman. A framed motto in his office said, "Attempt something so impossible that unless God is in it, it is doomed to failure."


Mr. DeMoss outlined his secret of spiritual success as:

- 1. Give God the <u>first</u> <u>day</u> of each week.
- 2. Give God the <u>first</u> <u>hour</u> of each day.
- 3. Give God the <u>first</u> <u>tenth</u>, at least, of each dollar that we earn.
- Give God the <u>first</u> <u>place</u> in my habits.
- 5. Give God the <u>first</u> <u>place</u> in my home.


Many Christians throw up their hands and say, "*I CAN'T do anything for the Lord in my Church!*" What does Philippians 4:13 have to say about such an attitude?

Ask your Timothy if he has a ministry of service yet in the church. What would he like to do? What is he equipped to do?




H. Your equipping is to complement the church.



Read 1 Corinthians 12:12-27. This passage likens our Church to a human body. Each individual member is like a part of that body. As the human body needs a variety of members (arms, legs, eyes, ears, etc.) so does the church body.

V. STEWARDSHIP OF OUR TREASURE




Review all of V. STEWARDSHIP OF OUR TREASURE

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Look up: Deuteronomy 8:18. Even though we may earn money through our own labor, this verse tells us it is the $L_{_}$ thy ____ Who gives us power (ability) to_____ get it. B. Is the practice of tithing for New Testament Christians?

1. Some people (usually those who do not want to tithe) say tithing was an Old Testament practice for Jews only. It was given as part of the Mosaic Law, and Christians are not under the Law, but under Grace (Romans 6:14b). However, look at the following Scriptures:

A commenced it (Genesis 14:18-20) J continued it (Genesis 28:20-22) M confirmed it (Leviticus 27:30) M commanded it (Malachi 3:10) J commended it (Matchew 23:23) G commissioned it (1 Cor. 9:14) P conformed it (1 Corinthians 16:2)

2. A study of these Scriptures shows that tithing is a **SCRIPTURAL PRINCIPLE.**

Comment:

Life, health, strength, skill, opportunities, connections, station in life, I.Q., everything is a gift from God. He gave it to you, and He can take it away at any time.

Give your Timothy a copy of the tract entitled *A Biblical Basis For Storehouse Tithing*.

Abraham and Jacob tithed 500 years before the Law was instituted. Moses, Malachi, and Jesus spoke of tithing *during* the period of the Law. The Apostle Paul explained tithing after the Law. **Christians ought to tithe!**


С. How should Christians practice tithing?
